## Volcanica Open Access policy

#### AUTHORSHIP STATEMENT

Policy document drafted with the input and approval of the Volcanica Editorial Committee.

#### 1 Policy Statement

Volcanica is committed to a publication system that is both **Free to publish** and **Free to access**. A rigorous peer review system assures impartial assessment of quality scientific research which, thanks to Open Journal Systems<sup>1</sup> (part of the Public Knowledge Project), can be accessed freely, by anyone.

Volcanica's policy is one of "diamond open access," (DOA) also known as "platinum open access" or "sponsored open access". Characteristic features of our DOA approach are:

- Expert peer review of manuscripts under consideration;
- Immediate public access to the final, published version of all articles;
- No limitations to public access through embargoes or access fees (tolls, personal or institutional subscriptions, paywalls, adwalls);
- Zero cost to authors, including their grants and/or affiliated institutions;

Volcanica shall not levy Article Processing Charges (APCs) of any kind; this zero-charge policy extends to voluntary APCs.

Moreover, all published material is licensed under a Creative Commons Attribution 4.0 International License<sup>2</sup>. This means that as an author, you retain the copyright, and are free to share, copy, and redistribute the material in any medium or format, and even adapt the material for any purpose. The licensor cannot revoke these freedoms as long as the license terms are followed. Specifically, appropriate credit must be given, a link to the license provided, and the user must indicate if changes were made. This may be done in any reasonable manner, but not in any way that suggests the licensor endorses the user or the usage. Full details are available here<sup>3</sup>.

### 2 Volcanica sponsor

No publishing venture is entirely cost-free. However, the aim of Volcanica is that the costs are not transferred to the authors and readers of our content. Currently, our sponsored expenditures cover:

- Membership to an organisation which provides digital object identifiers (DOIs) to be assigned to published articles. A DOI is a serial code used to uniquely identify objects (e.g. online articles), meaning that your published work can be accessed at any time.
- 2. Web hosting. The site is hosted by HostingUK (formerly UnitedHosting), a UK registered privately owned and debt-free company. Their independently monitored service is highly reliable, with a proven uptime record of over 99.999%. Moreover, HostingUK is a "green" web hoster, committed to minimising their environmental impact and supporting renewable energy initiatives.

These costs are currently funded by an institutional publishing press (Presses universitaires de Strasbourg<sup>4</sup>), based in France.

Previous public cost estimates also included the projected cost of archiving content. An online archiving service, which means that data are securely stored and preserved. Currently, articles are archived via our webhost and LOCKSS<sup>5</sup>, a secure online repository.
