1 Plagiarism

Plagiarism is copying the text, data, images, figure captions, or ideas of another person or group, then passing that text or idea off as your own. Any such copied material must be clearly identified, separated from the primary text, and duly credited. By this we mean that the original source of the material must be cited. Plagiarism is tantamount to fraud, and detection of plagiarism will result in rejection of a submitted manuscript.
